**Water Service Rate Adjustment
For Customers of Torrance Municipal Water (TMW)**

In February 2011, the City Council approved a plan at a Public Hearing to adjust water rates over the five year period of 2011 through 2015 for customers served by the municipal system. In addition, a conservation tiered rate structure was adopted to encourage ongoing conservation and meet State of California mandated reduction targets. The adjustments are necessary to provide for water system infrastructure replacement, meet current and future regulatory requirements, offset higher water costs and fund the development of additional local water resources. The new local water resources will diversify TMW's water supply sources, enhance the community's supply reliability and significantly lower water costs to help stabilize water rates in the future.

The rate adjustment consists of two components: an internal adjustment and a pass-through adjustment to offset higher water costs. In accordance with the five year adopted rate plan, the overall increase will be approximately 4.4% effective in January 2013. The increase consists of a 3 % internal adjustment based on the annual change in the Los Angeles region consumer price index (CPI), and a 1.4% pass-through adjustment to compensate for higher water costs, primarily for purchased imported water supplies from the Metropolitan Water District of Southern California. Even with this adjustment, Torrance Municipal Water rates are expected to remain among the lowest in the area.

Use Water Wisely – Its Essential

Although the water situation has improved from the drought conditions experienced during 2007-2010, California faces an uncertain water picture this year and in the future. Regardless of the occurrence of periodic droughts, California has a long term water shortage situation, due to a projected imbalance between supply sources and demands. To meet this challenge, the California Legislature enacted the Water Conservation Act of 2009 (SBx7-7, also known as the 2020 Plan) to preserve statewide water resources. The Act calls for a 20% overall reduction in overall urban water use in by the year 2020 to ensure continued reliability of urban water supplies. Thanks to the efforts of our customers, Torrance has made considerable progress toward reaching this conservation target. However, it is necessary that we all continue to conserve.
